We prayed for those who went to bed terrified if they would wake up the next morning because they live in Gaza, which continues to be impacted by the attack of Israel.


We prayed for those who went to bed worried that night, afraid for their parents who are fighting a war against Russia in Ukraine. We prayed for the 8 year old and 5 year old who had to put themselves to bed last night because their parents are having to work two-three jobs to make ends meet.

Our prayers could go on, and I hope yours will. As I was reflecting on the time I had with our community at that worship service I was reminded of Kurt Bestor's song Prayer of the Children. He composed this over 30 years ago and when asked why, here is what he said: "But none of my compositions has had the kind of reach and emotional effect of Prayer of the Children. Ironically, I never intended to publish the song at all. I wrote it out of frustration over the horrendous civil war and ethnic cleansing taking place in the former country of Yugoslavia." If you have time, I would encourage you to search on-line for a recorded version of this beautiful song. Try to find Singing Brothers of Stillwell and their recording from 2018. Wow.

Here are some of the lyrics of this powerful song.

Can you hear the prayer of the children?
On bended knee,
in the shadow of an unknown room
Empty eyes with no more tears to cry
Turning heavenward toward the light
Crying Jesus*, help me
To see the morning light-of one more day
But if I should die before I wake,
I pray my soul to take

Indeed our prayers, actions and work must continue to go on. May you be empowered to find ways to tend to these among us, listening to their prayers and knowing we can be the hands and feet of Jesus tending to their needs.

Dear Siblings in Christ,

What a joy to have you all celebrating my ordination! Thank you to all who showed up at the service. For all who sent their words of encouragement. And for all who even thought about it. You all make up my cloud of witnesses. Those who are surrounding me with your persistence and faith that God is really at work in this world and we in the church are called to be a part of that. It is an honor to have been called by people in the church and the Holy Spirit into the role of pastor to walk alongside you all as we see what God has in store next for us.

During the sermon at my ordination service, Pastor Jodi Houge shared a story about two marathon runners. One was looking rather strong. The other was definitely struggling. The stronger of the two lagged behind just a bit and waved his arms to get the crowd's attention and pointed at his friend who was struggling to keep going. The crowd cheered for that runner. The friend waved his arms again and pointed, asking the crowd to cheer louder. The crowd did. And they witnessed the effect take hold in the struggling runner's body as his steps became stronger and his head lifted. Then Pastor Jodi asked who among the assembly would be willing to be that sort of support for me while I am in this life of ministry. As I looked around... so many of you had your hands up. It was humbling. It was such a gift to be surrounded by you all who are willing to acknowledge how hard ministry can be for pastors sometimes, and be willing to encourage and support me through it. a blessing this congregation is to your pastors. And this week, as I recover from the joyous day of ordination and walk with the families of Diane Hedenstad and Gary Vietor as they plan their loved ones' funerals, I am so thankful that Christian congregations like this exist. It is part of the life of the church to show up for one another so none of us have to face the hard times alone. We can continue to share the promise of Jesus that whatever feels like it is the end, when it feels like death has won and we cannot go on, that is where Jesus surprises us with healing and new life. And we are willing to accept that it takes some time. Jesus walks along the road of grief with us. Jesus walks along in our life struggles. And Jesus transforms them into something new.

I want to leave you with the words of Hebrews 12:1-2 from *The Message* translation. "Do you see what this means—all these pioneers who blazed the way, all these veterans cheering us on? It means we'd better get on with it. Strip down, start running—and never quit! No extra spiritual fat, no parasitic sins. Keep your eyes on Jesus, who both began and finished this race we're in." We are in this race together. Sometimes running, sometimes stumbling. But always in it together. Giving thanks to those who have gone before us. Making sure we are bringing along those who travel with us. Hoping to make the path better for those that come after us. Thank you for being the ones I have the privilege to travel with.


